



Dear Sir:

Referring to previous correspondence with reference to the plugging of what you designate as Well No. 5 located in Section 23, T34S, R24E San Juan County, Utah, particularly your letters of October 9 and November 19, 1957.

We forwarded to you with our letter dated December 19, 1957, a log of this well filled out and signed by the consulting geologist, Mr. R. E. Lauth of Durango, Colorado, who sat on the well for Mr. Sitton, who was the actual operator on the well under farmout agreement from us, and which log designates the well as White Canyon Mining Company Frost et al No. 1. Since this is the only well drilled in this section we trust this mix-up in well designation will not confuse or inconvenience you or necessitate any further action on our part in connection with the designation.

As stated in our previous correspondence and as advised you in person by Mr. L. W. Folmar, Texaco Petroleum Engineer, the records of White Canyon Mining Company are very incomplete as to the drilling and plugging information on this well and it has been necessary for us to procure this data from Mr. Lauth, who was really in charge of operations on the well for the Operator; so, accordingly, we are enclosing herewith facsimile (Thermofax) copy of the following:

1. Letter of Mr. Robert E. Lauth, Consulting Geologist, Durango, Colorado, to Mr. E. W. Lewis, dated December 11, 1957.
2. Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Company tickets issued in connection with the material used and work done in the plugging operations on this well.

I believe these tickets and the letter are sufficient to show the well has been properly plugged mechanically but if you or Mr. Hauptman, the petroleum engineer, were not notified to be present at the plugging; as, seemingly, was the case, we realize then to that extent the plugging

is improper; or, at least, lame or faulty according to your rules and regulations. If this failure to give notification of plugging exists then, we want to know how further to proceed in the matter to satisfy you and we will thank you to so advise us.

We trust, in any event, that it will not be necessary to have another plugging or other unit to visit this well as, obviously, this would be somewhat expensive and we would certainly like to avoid this expense, if possible. It occurred to us that possibly with the enclosed data (we can send you the original of Mr. Lauth's letter if it is necessary) or maybe an Affidavit from Mr. Lauth, that you would consider the mechanics of plugging the well complied with and all that would be necessary would be for you to visit the location with our representative, if the latter is required, to give you o.k. on the plugging.

If it is necessary for a visit to the location and/or absolutely necessary, but we hope such will not be the case, that a unit be sent to the location, then how much notice will you require?

For your information White Canyon Mining Company does not have any personnel familiar with oil matters and has asked The Texas Company personnel to attend to this matter for it, and it has consented to do so. That is the reason that the letter of Mr. Lauth was addressed to Mr. Lewis, c/o The Texas Company, and further that will be the reason Texaco personnel will handle any matter at the location, as you may require, in behalf of White Canyon Mining Company.

We certainly regret that this plugging was not to your entire satisfaction in the beginning and trust that the matter can be satisfactorily worked out without further expense on our part, particularly that the well will not have to be re-entered and again plugged.






