





NOW, THEREFORE, the Board, having considered the testimony adduced and the exhibits received at said hearing and being fully advised in the premises, now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS

1. Due and regular notice of the time, place and purpose of the hearing was given to all interested parties as required by law and the Rules and Regulations of the Board.

2. The Board has jurisdiction over the matter covered by said Application and over all parties interested therein and has jurisdiction to make and promulgate the Order hereinafter set forth.

3. The Board hereby finds that the Uinta Formation is an underground reservoir containing gas and associated hydrocarbons in a pool constituting a common source of supply from which such substances may be produced.

4. Such a common source of supply underlies the following described lands situated in Uintah County, Utah:

5. To prevent waste of gas and associated hydrocarbons, to avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, and to protect correlative rights, drilling units should be established for production from such common source of supply.

6. Each drilling unit shall consist of one-quarter section as surveyed by the United States Government, comprising 160 acres, more or less.

7. The permitted well for each such drilling unit should be located anywhere in said unit provided it is not nearer than 500 feet to any drilling unit boundary line, nor nearer than 1320 feet to any existing gas well capable of producing gas from the Uinta Formation in commercial quantities,

provided, a uniform pattern is followed except where there is a topographical or geological need to change the pattern or well location.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That drilling units are hereby established for the production of gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Uinta Formations underlying the following described lands situated in Uintah County, Utah:

2. That each one-quarter section in the above described sections as surveyed by the United States Government shall constitute a drilling unit containing 160 acres more or less.

3. That no more than one well shall be drilled on any such drilling unit for the production of gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Uinta Formation.

4. That the permitted well for each drilling unit shall be located anywhere in said unit provided it is not nearer than 500 feet to any drilling unit boundary line nor nearer than 1320 feet to any existing gas well capable of producing gas from the Uinta Formation in commercial quantities, provided a uniform pattern is followed except where there is a topographical or geological need to change the pattern or well location.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

A. That a copy of each electrical log obtained from

each well drilled on any drilling unit on lands described herein shall be filed with the Board of Oil & Gas Conservation as soon as final copies of same are developed.

B. That no sand reservoir capable of producing gas in any well on lands described herein shall be produced if an adjacent well has had previous production of oil from the same sand reservoir.

C. That this order shall remain in effect for a period of one (1) year, and that the matters set forth herein shall again be heard by the board at its regularly scheduled meeting in January, 1972.

D. That during said one-year period the Board, on its own motion, may call a hearing to hear any new evidence as to the matters set forth herein.

E. That during said one-year period, any interested party may file an application requesting a hearing to present any new evidence concerning the matters set forth herein.

F. That the Board retains continuing jurisdiction of all matters covered by this Order and particularly retains continuing jurisdiction to make further orders as appropriate and authorized by statute and applicable regulations.

E. That during said one-year period, any interested party may file an application requesting a hearing to present any new evidence concerning the matters set forth herein.

F. That the Board retains continuing jurisdiction of all matters covered by this order and particularly retains continuing jurisdiction to make further orders as appropriate and authorized by statute and applicable regulations.
